Healthy Question – John 5:1-15

The third miraculous sign in John's account of Jesus' life signals a change in the direction of John's account. Up to this point we have seen a progression of people coming to trust in and follow Jesus. Firstly, John 1:35-51 tells us of how Jesus' early disciples, humble Jewish fishermen, came to follow him. Next, in John 3:1-21, we see a Jewish Pharisee named Nicodemus seek out Jesus at night. After this, in John 4:1-29, a Samaritan woman has her eyes opened to see that Jesus is the Messiah sent from God. And then in John 4:43 -54 we read about a royal official, probably a Roman gentile, taking Jesus at his word and believing in him. The identity of Jesus is gradually spreading out into the world. However, as we start John 5 we pick up that the message of Jesus does not spread without opposition. This opposition, beginning with the Jews, will end is Jesus' death, but this is exactly why Jesus, the lamb of God, came into the world.


